SNEAK PREVIEW about the process of becoming

Mariel Miranda & Konstantin Weber

A message in a bottle or an archive of how two artists became friends [MEX-GER] I 2023

A message in a bottle or an archive of how two artists became friends weaves a shelter of connections. The two artists through a provoking questionnaire and over 50 hours of voice messages exchange, explore the power of vulnerability and trust, enveloping visitors in an immersive installation featuring weaving, sound, and a touching book filled with personal revelations.



- a) Think more about the effectivity of each part (weaving, book, audio), and the overall atmosphere they will compose. What kind of inhabited sculpture the weaving could produce in relation with its sizes and form (body)?
- a) Remarking the idea of "the friendship as a home" Think in other ways to place the words, certain phrases etc. as part of the ambience, can be an interesting idea (writing on the wall, the soil) or think in ways in which the visitors can take of with them some ideas or provocations.
- a) How big we imagine the book to emphasize a volume and weight of information?
- a) Discuss more about friendship in political terms, and its implication in the individualis art system



Flickering Trophies I 2023

Flickering Trophies combines the history and present state of two kinds of trophies, the trophy trucks that cross the península of Baja California and the precious hummingbirds dwelling in displays within several Natural History Museums in Europe.

The cars cross the Mexican landscape at a breathtaking speed and degrading the land,

whereas the birds that used to populate these lands have been banned into a ghostly existence behind glass, collecting dust and losing their once radiant colors. This piece will discuss topics of collection, speed, failure, migration,



and the anthropocentric thrill of capturing and experiencing beauty in its most fragile form.




Eleana Konstantellos André
